November Term 1836 against George W. Powell has proved unenforceable
and being recovered to the plaintiffs to proceed against the other
defendants for further relief, the Court doth adjudge, order and decree
that the defendants Nathaniel Francis N. Williams, W. H. Nicholson
and Envoy Battle do pay to the Plaintiff Septimus T. Powell the sum of
Two Thousand eight hundred and four dollars and ninety three cents
with interest on the sum of Two thousand two hundred and twenty seven
dollars and seventy three cents to part thereof from the 18th of August
1836, till paid and that they pay to the plaintiffs Joseph E. Powell
and Mary E. Powell his wife the sum of Nineteen hundred and ninety
Dollars and fifty seven cents, with interest on the sum of Fifteen hundred
and fifty eight dollars and seventy seven cents to part thereof from the
18th of August 1836, till paid and the Court doth further adjudge,
order and decree that the said defendants pay to the plaintiffs
their costs by them in this suit expended.
