This day this cause came on to be further heard on the papers formerly read, and on the report of Commissioner Webb made in pursuance of a order of the Court pronounced at November Term 1866, to which report there is no exception, and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court on forming said report, doth adjudge, order and decree that David Grizzard, a administrator of Shadrach Barham deceased, deliver to Martha J. Barham the slave & with the proceedings mentioned David Grizzard and Lucy to be held by her during her natural life, with remainder in fee simple to Godson Barham and William Barham. And the Court doth further order and decree that the said David Grizzard administrator as a special pay to Martha J. Barham the sum of nine dollars and fifty cents with interest from 1st day of January 1866 till paid. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that David Grizzard administrator of Susanna Barham and Georgianna Barham pay to Martha J. Barham the sum of Twelve hundred and ten dollars and twenty cents with interest from 1st day of May 1867, being the balance due from him as administrator of said Susanna Barham and Georgianna Barham deceased. But the said Martha J. Barham is not to have the benefit of this decree against David Grizzard administrator of Susanna Barham and Georgianna Barham until she shall enter into Bond with one or more sufficient securities in the Clerk's Office of this Court in the penalty of Three thousand six hundred and sixty six dollars and forty seven cents conditional to pay at her death to Godson Barham and William Barham the sum of Twelve hundred and ten dollars and twenty cents with interest thereon from 1st May 1867, provided however, that the estate of the said Martha J. Barham after her death shall not be bound to pay to the said Godson Barham and William Barham more than Eighteen hundred and thirty three dollars and twenty three cents with interest from the time after death. And the Court doth further order that this decree be suspended, until Martha J. Barham shall execute to David Grizzard a refunding bond with sufficient security in the penalty of Three thousand four hundred and twenty dollars and forty cents conditional to refund her due proportion of any debts which may be recovered against the estate of Shadrach Barham and the cost of such recovery. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that David Grizzard out of the moneys in his hands which has accrued on the sum of Twelve hundred and ten dollars and twenty cents, since 1st day of January 1866, pay the expenses and costs of this suit.
