

This cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and the report
of the Commissioner made pursuant to an order of the court at the December Term
1847, to which no exception has been filed and was argued by Counsel. On consideration
whereof the court doth concur in the said report, and it appearing that the claim of the
plaintiff amounts to the sum of fifty five dollars and twenty one cents with interest
from the 15th February 1848, the court doth adjudge, order and decree that the said
Elijah Joyner ^{and} pay in part satisfaction of plaintiff's claim ^{and} pay him the sum
of fifty dollars and fifty five cents with interest on twenty dollars fifty five cents
paid thereof from the 31st of August 1847 till paid. And the interest to thirty
dollars till the balance shant from the 1st January 1848 till paid. And the said
Elijah Joyner is further directed to meet out and receive the rest of the land tract
of land in the report mentioned coming due on the 31st December 1848 and continue
to meet the said land out from year to year, and the proceeds apply to the full discharge
of the balance of the said plaintiff's demands and interest and the cost of
this suit. And liberty is hereby reserved to the complainant to apply for any further
other order or decree in this suit which may be most proper or necessary.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning ten O'Clock
