

This cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and the report
of the Commissioner made pursuant to an order of this Court at the November Term
1847, to which no exception has been filed and was argued by Counsel. On consideration
whereof the Court doth confirm the said report, and it appearing that the claim of the
plaintiff amounts to the sum of fifty five dollars and twenty two cents with interest
from the 15th February 1845, the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the said
Elijah Soyner pay in full satisfaction of plaintiff's claim ^{due} from the sum
of fifty dollars and fifty five cents with interest on the said fifty five cents
from the 31st of August 1847 till paid. And with interest on the
said ~~bill~~ ^{bill} due thereof from the 1st January 1848 till paid. And the said
Elijah Soyner is further directed to put out and receive the rent of the said land
of hand in the report mentioned coming due on the 31st December 1848, and continue
to rent the said land from year to year, and the proceeds apply to the full dis-
charge of the balance of the said plaintiff's demand and interest and the costs of
this suit. And liberty is hereby reserved to the complainant to apply for any further
or other order or decree in this suit which may be made proper or necessary.

Or decreed that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning ten o'clock
