

debt is full and void and that the same be set aside and unless the defendants William D. Cutler and George Cutler creditors of them do within sixty days after the date hereof pay unto the plaintiff Ebenezer Jameson the sum of five hundred and fifty seven dollars and seventy six cents with interest on One hundred and twenty one dollars and sixty one cents from the 24th June 1843 on One hundred and twenty eight dollars and fifty eight cents from the 24th of June 1844 on One hundred and thirty five dollars and forty three cents from the 24th of June 1845 and on One hundred and forty two dollars and thirty one cents from the 24th June 1846 till paid; and the cost expended by the plaintiff in prosecuting the suit: that the Sheriff William D. Cutler after giving twenty days previous notice by advertisement at the Court house and on the premises do report to said at the Court house by public auction separately at a credit of nine months except @ sum in cash sufficient to pay the expenses of sale the several tracts of land and premises mentioned in the bill and here particularly described in the debt referred to from William D. Cutler to George Cutler: and that he take of the purchase or purchasers bill with good security for the purchase money and set the same in the Court and make Report to Court in order for a final decree
