Commissioner of this Court proceed to take the following accounts—First an account of
the transactions of the said William J. Gibell on the estate of the said Daniel
H. Drongode dec^d in taking which account the said Commissioner is directed to
ascertain what debts paid by the said administrator bound the real estate descended—
Secondly an account of the real estate whereof the said Daniel H. Drongode died
debt and property or otherwise entitled by which descended to his children and
heirs together with an account of the annual and fee simple value thereof—
Thirdly an account and statement of the plaintiffs demand— and liberty is reserved
to all other creditors of the said Daniel H. Drongode dec^d to appear and prove
their claims before the Commissioner upon the usual terms, which said several accounts
the said Commissioner will state and settle and report to Court with any matter
deemed pertinent by himself or required by the parties to be specially stated—
