This Court cause as this day to be heard on the original and amended bill the names of the defendant, plaintiff and respondents to the same together with the exhibits referred to and the examination of the witness and upon the argument of Counsel the Consideration whereof the Court being of opinion that no consequence of the relations that existed between the plaintiff and the defendant and of the particular history, conduct, and disposition of spirit under which the former labored and was suffering at the time the debt and bond in the bill referred to were executed each bearing date on the 15th day of November 1843 ought to be set aside and adjudge order and decree that the said debt and bond be and the same are hereby discharged full and void and the Court doth further adjudge and direct and decree that the Commissioners of this Court take an account of the dealings and transactions between the said plaintiff and the said Defendant since the execution of the said debt showing the amount of the profit and loss of the slaves & other property conveyed by the said Plaintiff to the defendant together with the amount money received and paid since the execution of the said by the said defendant for or on account of the said Plaintiff which account the Commissioner is directed to examine State and Report with any matters which he may deem pertinent, or which may be required by the parties to be stated.
