in the part payment of the debts against the same and that there is still due  
the sum of one hundred and sixty three dollars and thirty cents with interest  
from the 20<sup>th</sup> January 1849 to Henry W. Holloman the sum of one hundred  
dollars twenty seven cents to Robert Prichard with interest from the 28<sup>th</sup> day  
of January 1849 until the sum of eighty eight dollars & fifty eight cents  
with interest from the 19<sup>th</sup> February 1849 to Joseph and Robert Prichard and  
the sum of eight hundred & forty one dollars & sixty seven cents with interest  
from the 20<sup>th</sup> January 1849 to Eddy Bay and  
Caroline his wife. On Consideration whereof the Court doth make adjudget  
and decree that unless the defendants Catharine Diffron and Mary Diffron  
& James Diffron or either of them or some one for them do within thirty days  
after the date hereof pay unto Henry W. Holloman or his assignee the sum  
of one hundred & sixty three dollars and thirty cents with interest from the 20<sup>th</sup>  
January 1849 till paid to Robert Prichard or his assignee the sum of one  
hundred dollars and twenty seven cents with interest from the 20<sup>th</sup> January 1849  
till paid to Joseph & Robert Prichard or their assignee the sum of eighty eight  
dollars & fifty eight cents with interest from the 19<sup>th</sup> February 1849 till paid  
to Eddy Bay and Caroline Bay the sum of twenty one dollars and seventy  
cents with interest from the 20<sup>th</sup> January 1849 till paid: And to Joshua Diffron  
the sum of eight hundred and sixty one dollars and sixty seven cents with  
interest at six hundred & eighty four dollars and thirty eight cents as part thereof  
from the December 1847 until the cost of this suit that the Sheriff whose  
bounty appointed & Commissioner for such purpose after having given twenty  
days previous notice by advertisement at the door of the Court house of this County  
and twelve previous notice to sue at the Court house by public auction and  
at least of six weeks except a sum in each sufficient to pay the expenses  
of sale & the cost of this suit, the tract of land and slave which are the
