This cause came on this day to be heard on the papers formerly
read and on the Report of William J. Howell Deputy of the
Sheriff acting as Commissioner under a decree of this Court in
this Cause pronounced at the May Term thereof 1847 to which
no exception has been filed, and was argued by Counsel: On
consideration whereof the Court doth confirm said Report of sale
made under the order aforesaid: And order and decree that the
said Sheriff Commissioner as aforesaid execute a deed for the
said Land to the purchaser James B. Hepburn, and it further
appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, that the several
creditors to wit: Henry B. Heggelman Robt Driford, Joseph
& Robert Driford and Gary Bay, have received full satisfaction
of the several debts directed to be paid them by the decree or
order of this Court of the 23 May 1847, or to execution taken
out by them respectively against the said Joshua Driford and
others and that only the said Joshua Driford's debt remains
unpaid: it is therefore ordered that the said Commissioner the
Sheriff aforesaid pay over to the said Joshua Driford the sum
of three hundred and two dollars the true balance of the purchase
money of the tract of Land sold as appears by the Report
aforesaid: and return the evidences of such payment to this Court
to be filed in the papers: and liberty is hereby awarded to the
parties, or any one of them for any ^{and} further relief that may be
met and fit in the premises.

E. B. Glau Executors of Benjamin Williamson do pay to the plaintiffs John Bizzard and Martha
his wife the sum of forty five dollars and sixty four cents with
interest thereon from September 1847 here paid: to E. B. Glau
Trustee for the benefit of Rebecca & Lundy the like sum with
like interest: to the same for the benefit of Alfred Lundy the
like sum with like interest: and the Court doth further adjudge
order and decree that E. B. Glau sell the slave Lucinda to
the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months after giving
ten days previous public notice by advertisement at two or more places
of the time and place of sale and take of the purchase there
