the said sum until he execute bond and security in the
Court Office of the County in the penalty of three hundred
dollars conditioned faithfully to perform the duties require
of him:

This day the cause came on against the board of the papers
formerly read the answers of John R. Briggs and Joseph
Briggs Depositions etc. and the Report of Commissioners
Vouchers made pursuant to the order of May Term 1849
to which no exception is filed answer argued by counsel. On
consideration whereof the Court conforming to the Report and being
of opinion that the real estate of which William Briggs de-
sired will have to be held back judgment order and direct that
John R. Briggs and Joseph H. Briggs who are both appointed
Commissioners of Court for that purpose do prosecute after having
given at least thirty days previous notice of the time and place
of sale at the Courthouse of Southampton County and publishing
the same in one of the newspapers in the Town of Petersburg
to sell at public auction to the highest bidder the Real estate
of which William Briggs died seized: and after removing so
much in cash as will defray the expence of sale. and the
cost of this suit take from the purchasers two bonds with
good security payable in two equal annual instalments for
the balance and Report the proceeding to court with said bonds
the Court shall further order that Commissioners be directed to the
account of the debt of Joseph H. Briggs and John R.
Briggs against the estate of the said William Briggs together
with all other outstanding debts against the estate of the
said Briggs which may be proved before him. But said
Commissioners are not to act under this decree until they have
executed in the Clerk's hand with good security in the penalty
of four thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs:
