B. Cloud and Joseph H. Dineen Executors of Benjamin Williamson do pay to the plaintiffe three cash by them in this suit expended: But the said Cloud shall not see the said slave until he executes bond and security in the Clerk's Office of this Court in the penalty of three hundred dollars conditioned faithfully to perform the duties required of him:

Bennett P. Brigg in his own right and as committed of Marilla Briggs Widow executrix of William Briggs deceased \$1000

This day this Cause came on again to be heard with the papers formerly read the answers of John R. Briggs and Joseph Briggs Replications thereto and the Report of Commissioners Goodwyn made pursuant to the order of May Term 1849 to which in objection is filed answer argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court confirming said Report and being of opinion that the real estate of which William Briggs died seized will have to be sold doth adjudge order and decree that John R. Briggs and Joseph Briggs who are hereby appointed Commissioners of Court for that purpose do provide after having given at least thirty days previous notice of the time and place of sale at the Courthouse of Southampton County and publishing the same in one of the newspapers in the Town of Petersburg to sell at public auction to the highest bidder the Real estate of which William Briggs died seized: and after receiving as much in cash as will defray the expenses of sale and the cost of this suit take from the purchasers two bonds with good security payable in two equal annual instalments for the balance and report their proceedings to Court with said bonds and account of the debts of Joseph Briggs and John R. Briggs against the estate of the said William Briggs together with all other outstanding debts against the estate of the said Briggs which may be proved before him: But said Commissioners are not to act under this decree until they have received in the Clerk's Office with good security in the penalty of four thousand dollars conditioned as the law direct:
