This day the cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly
read to the Report of Commissioner Benjamin Mader pursuant to the
order of November Term 1838. to which there is no exception & the court
confirming the same doth order & decree that unless the defendants
James M. Drumgoole & Wm. M. Drumgoole or agents for them or
before the 1st day of April next, pay to John M. Gurley the
sum of twenty five dollars with interest from November 1st 1847
To James M. DeHoll two hundred and twenty six dollars & fifty
cents with interest from March 15th 1847 To John M. Gurley
one hundred & fifty six dollars & nine cents with interest from
January 15th 1849 To same two hundred twenty five dollars
& eighty cents with interest from April 25th 1848 To same
fifty seven dollars & fifty one cent with interest from June 18th
1848 To same one hundred & twenty eight dollars and sixty cents
with interest from January 23rd 1848 To same thirty two
dollars & twenty cents with interest from January 3rd 1848
To same Eighty one dollars & thirty cents with interest from
August 23rd 1848 To same five hundred & twenty five dollars
with interest from August 1st 1847 To Thomas D. Ripley fifty
dollars with interest from December 31 1847 To Daniel M. Gurley
six dollars & twenty five cents with interest from February 10th
1848 To John M. Gurley sixty three dollars & seventy three cents with
interest from September 1st 1848 To James M. DeHoll one hundred
& sixteen dollars & twenty five cents with interest from January
20th 1848 To J. J. M. Mason one hundred & eighty two dollars and
thirty cents with interest on one hundred & twenty one dollars
& fifty three cents past thereof from June 20th 1847 To same William
Gurley one dollar eighty seven cents with interest on fifty five dollars
past thereof from April 2nd 1848 That John M. Gurley who is hereby
appointed Commissioner for that purpose shall after having given
twenty days public notice of the time and place of sale sell to the
highest bidder at the Court house of Southampton County on said
Court day the land in the proceedings mentioned whereof D. H.
Drumgoole died seized, and a credit of twelve months except so much
as he can in will be necessary to pay the expenses of said & the cost
of the suit & for the proceeds of sale after deducting the expenses
thereof & of this and the taxes and with good security & Report his
proceedings to Court in order to a final decree. But the said
Commissioner shall have no power to sell under this decree until he
shall have filed in the Clerk's office of this Court bond with good
security payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in a penalty
of ten thousand dollars. Conditioned as the law directs. And
