Charles L. Cooke against Jane, Josiah, Edwidge, Allen, Arverson, & Jane M. Jagers & others Defts. } In Chancery

This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and the report of Commissioner Deft made pursuant to the order of November Term 1829 to which report there was no exception, and the Court conforming the said defts. adjudge, order and decree, that each of the defendants Edwidge Jagers, Josiah Jagers, Allen Jagers, Arverson Jagers, Jane Jagers and Jane M. Jagers or some one for them before the expiration of sixty days, shall pay to William Arverson the sum of thirty nine dollars and eighty six cents with interest from the 21st of January 1825 and to Charles L. Cooke the sum of fifty two dollars and eighty one cents with interest from the 26th of April 1829 then Alexander Myrick the sheriff who is hereby appointed a special Commissioner for that purpose, shall after having given twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, sell to the highest bidder at the Court house of Southampton County on some Court day, the land in the proceedings mentioned whereof Thomas Jagers died seized, prepared to be delivered on the first of January next, on a credit of nine months, except so much in cash as will be necessary to pay the expenses of sale and costs of this suit, and for the proceeds of sale after deducting the expenses thereof and of this suit, to take a bond with good security. And the Court doth further decree that the said Alexander Myrick the sheriff shall collect the rents which may be due for said land at the expiration of the present year, and report his proceedings to Court.
