This day Martha F. B. Tyler who sues by her next friend Samuel B. Ames  
presented in Court her Bill in Chancery together with the exhibits therewith filed  
and moved for an injunction as prayed for by the bill. On consideration whereof  
the Court doth adjudge order and decree that Martha B. Rochelle, Simon Munger  
Ansel Davis and Morris F. Hicks be restrained from removing or causing to be  
removed from the Commonwealth of Virginia or permitting the same to be so removed  
the slaves, Caroline, Mary, Lucy, Minnie, Cepes, Emma and George, and that  
the said Ansel Davis if he still has the slaves in his possession enter into bond with  
good security in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned to have the said slaves  
forthcoming to answer the decree of this Court to be made in this cause, and if he  
fail to do so that the Sergeant of the Term of Petersburg take the same into  
his possession and hire them out by the month until the further order of the Court  
and render to the Court an account at its next term. But if the said Lewis F.  
Hicks has possession of the said slaves that he enter into bond with good security  
in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned to have the said slaves forthcoming  
to answer the decree of this Court to be made in this cause, and if he fail to do so  
that the Sergeant of the Term of Petersburg, or if the same have been removed  
therefrom by the said Hicks and are still held by him, that the Sheriff of the  
County in which the same may be, take the same into his possession and hire  
them out by the month until the further order of the Court and render to the Court  
an account at its next term. But the complainant is not to have the benefit  
of this order until some one or more persons for her shall enter into bond, in  
the Clerk's Office of this Court in the penalty of One hundred dollars, in  
sufficient  
mills.
