It appearing that the plaintiffs have pursued the course prescribed by law
against the above defendants John T. Blot administrator of John T. Blot deceased,
Alexander P. Peets, Henry Welch and Henry T. Mayhew and the subpoenas awarded
in this cause having been returned executed as Bullock D. Barnard administrator
of John T. Blot dec'd and Siftha Darden Sheriff and Commissioner of Richard Blunt
deceased and the said defendants still failing to appear and answer, although two
months have elapsed since the plaintiffs filed their bill, on motion of the plaintiffs
it is taken for granted as to those defendants. And the cause come on to be heard on
the bill and exhibits answers of the defendants William W. Cobb administrator of Jno.
Cobb, Siftha Darden Sheriff and Commissioner of the estate of Benjamin Cobb and
George P. Gray administrator of Thomas Fitchett dec'd and the subpoenas thereto
and were argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the court doth adjudge order
and decree that William W. Cobb administrator Commissioner of this court an
account of the transactions of his intestate as trustee of the Attorney and
Newmarket Tribe of Indians and that the said Commissioner report the same to
Court together with any matter specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or
which either of the parties may require to be so stated. And leave is granted the plaintiffs
to amend their bill and make new parties -
