Defts

It appearing that the plaintiffs have pursued the course prescribed by law
against the above defendants John F. Blaw administrator of John F. Blaw deceased,
Alexander P. Peck, Henry Welch and Henry T. Mayhew and the subpoenas awarded
in this cause having been returned executed on Bullock D. D. Arkum administrator
of John F. Blaw dec^d and Sophia Darrow Sheriff and Committee of Richard Blunt
deceased and the said defendants still failing to appear and answer, although two
months have elapsed since the plaintiffs filed ~~their~~ their bill. on motion of the plaintiffs
it is taken for confessed as to those defendants. And the cause came on to be heard on
the bill and exhibits, answers of the defendants William W. Cobb administrator of Jesse
Cobb, Sophia Darrow Sheriff and Committee of the estate of Benjamin Cobb and
George B. Gray administrator of Thomas Fitzpatrick dec^d and the replications thereto
and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order
and decree that William W. Cobb ~~administrator~~ a Commissioner of this Court on
account of the transactions of his intestate as ~~trustee~~ trustee of the Athens and
Nausumund Tribe of Indians and that the said Commissioner report the same to
Court together with any matter specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or
which either of the parties may require to be so stated. And leave granted the plaintiffs
to amend their bill and make new parties -

The bill in this cause having been filed and the subpoenas awarded on the Defendants
A. M. Howell and St. J. Mahone more than two months and they still failing to
appear and answer the bill. and the defendant Abram Riddick who is out of this
country and against whom the plaintiffs have proceeded in the mode prescribed by law
against absent defendants also still failing to appear and answer, the Court, on motion
of the plaintiffs by their attorney the same is taken for confessed as to those defendants
And the cause coming on this day to be heard on the bill and exhibits and on the
answer of the defendant Humphrey T. Smith administrator of Lewis W. Bishop dec^d
and general replication thereto was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof
