the Court doth adjudge, order and direct that the Defendant Henry S. Smith administrator of the said deceased Wm Bishop deceased render before a Commissioner of this Court an account of his transactions as administrator of the said Lewis Wm Bishop deceased, in stating where account the said Commissioner will take the account returned by the said defendant to the County Court of Northampton as prima facie correct but subject to be searched and falsified by the plaintiff, and the said Defendant is hereby required to produce before the said Commissioner the books vouchers and other papers in his possession touching the matter referred to in the said audited account and to submit to be examined in solemn form before the said Commissioner in relation to the matter in controversy between the parties - and the Commissioner will also ascertain and report what debts are due to the said intestate and the probability of recovering the same, and whether any other effects of the said intestate are likely to come into the hands of the said defendant, which said account the said Commissioner will state both and to the Court report with such other matters deemed pertinent by himself or required by any of the parties to be so stated -

Henry T. Smith in his own right and as administrator of Lewis W. Bishop deceased for the benefit of himself and other creditors of Clement Rochelle deceased <sup>affidavit</sup> against

Richard A. Grump administrator de bonis non with the will annexed of Clement Rochelle deceased as unadministered by Wm A. Spark deceased. The former executor John M. Gandy executor of the said Wm A. Spark deceased, George H. Grump and Judith his wife, the said Richard A. Grump individually and Mary Jane his wife and others debtors. This cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of Tazewell Taylor, the receiver in the cause under the decree of Nov 8<sup>th</sup> 1849, showing the collection of all the bonds taken for the sale of the lands of the testator Clement Rochelle, which were sold by R. A. Grump Special Commissioner under the decree pronounced in this cause on the 15<sup>th</sup> November 1848 except the bond of J. H. Bishop, which is yet uncollected, and distribution and payment of the said sum so collected by him in compliance with the directions of said first mentioned decree as shown by the receipts accompanying the said report, except the sum of forty seven Dollars and Thirty cents due Robert Gillow, the sum of twenty two Dollars and forty cents due Samuel A. Baird the sum of Thirty one Dollars and ten cents due Thomas P. Little and of twenty five dollars and two cents due to Simeon H. Bishop, which the said Commissioner reports he is ready to pay over to the respective parties upon demand, and also upon the report of Commissioner Goodwyn taken and returned to Court in pursuance of the decreetal order made herein on the 8<sup>th</sup> November 1849 and on the exceptions filed to said report by the defendant John M. Gandy executor of Wm A. Spark deceased and was argued by Counsel - On consideration whereof The Court doth confirm the report of the said Tazewell Taylor receiver and overrule the exceptions to the report of Commissioner
