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26th April 1849, for \$800. invested in the name of Elizabeth Carter Organ ^{and} in
the part of the proceeds of the interest of C. H. Eoller dec'd in the real
estate in the proceedings mentioned, remain in the papers in this cause
under the control of this Court subject to the limitations of the will
of C. H. Eoller and according to the provisions of the act of Assembly under which
the said real estate was sold. But the said Elizabeth Carter Organ shall be
at liberty; and she is hereby expressly authorized to collect the interest
already due, or which may hereafter become due during her life on the
said certificates of State Stock No: 278 and No 724. And the
Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that the costs of
this suit be equally borne by the parties. And this cause is thus
finally terminated, except as to the proceeds of the interest
of C. H. Eoller dec'd in the real estate aforesaid, for the final dis-
position of which according to the provisions of the act of Assembly
as aforesaid, this suit will be retained upon the docket.
