That he take bonds and security of the purchaser for the purchase money, and return the title to the land until the purchase money is paid. That he report to the Court in order to a further decree, filing the bonds with his report.

It appearing to the Court that the Defendant Mason Jane Jones has intermarried with Thomas Jones, it is ordered that this cause be discontinued against the said Jones & wife. And the cause coming on this day to be finally heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of the Commissioner marked (Y.) and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court confirming said report & which there is no exception, doth adjudge, order and decree that Elizabeth Myrick Sheriff & pay to Thomas Jones and Mason J. his wife the sum of \$125.58 with interest thence from the 15th day of November 1851, till paid being the balance which hands arising from the sale of Thomas Jones's real estate after paying the debts. That the said Jones & wife shall not have the benefit of this decree until they or some one for them enter into bond & security in the Clerk's office of this Court in the penalty of \$250.00 payable to Newton Jones, conditioned to pay to him the sum of \$125.58 in the event that Mason J. Jones shall die without having issue.
