This day this cause came on to be finally heard on the papers, formerly read and on the report of Commissioner Holt, made in pursuance of a decree of this Court rendered at May Term 1853, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court confirming said report to which there is no exception, doth adjudge, order and decree that James Clayton administrator of Silas Sumnerall out of his own estate do pay to the plaintiff the sum of \$747.40 with interest thereon from January 1<sup>st</sup> 1854, till paid, in full satisfaction of the debt filed by the Plaintiff as an exhibit in this cause marked (K), and the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that James Clayton administrator of Silas Sumnerall pay out of the assets in his hands to be administered to the plaintiff his estate about his suit in this behalf expended

Whiting who is hereby appointed a commissioner for said purposes, proceed to sell at public auction to the highest bidder in a court of six months, does so much as may be necessary to defray expenses of this suit of debt which may be in cash taking from the purchases six bonds of equal amount for the next proceeds with ample security on payable to Mrs. M. Whiting, one to Silas M. Whiting, Sarah Whiting, Virginia Whiting, Martha S. Whiting, each, of one payable to Mrs. M. Whiting the infant heir of Joshua Whiting dec'd.
