This cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of Commissioner Goodenough made and returned to court in pursuance of the docketal order entered at the May Term 1852, to which there is no exception nor was any made by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the court confirming the report doth adjudge, order and decree that the injunction awarded the Plaintiff on the 3rd day of December 1849 to enjoin the defendant from proceeding in the said judgment in the bill mentioned obtained in the Circuit Court for the County of Southampton in favor of the defendants testator against the plaintiff be made perpetual except for the sum of \$70.55 with interest from the 20th day of June 1848, and that as to the said sum of \$70.55 with interest as aforesaid the said injunction be dissolved: and it is further ordered that each party pay their own costs.

This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read together with the report of Commissioner Cook made pursuant to the order of May Term 1852, to which there is no exception and was agreed by Counsel on consideration whereof the Court confirming and approving said report, doth adjudge, order and decree that Benjamin Vick administratrix of John Vick pay to the plaintiff out of the estate of his intestate the sum of \$519.59 with interest thereon from the 3rd June 1853, together with the costs of this suit. And the Court doth further order that if the said sum of \$519.59 together with the costs of this suit is not paid by the said Vick administratrix as aforesaid or by the defendants named in the bill, or some one for them within sixty days from the date of this decree that the negro woman Phoebe and her child Charles in the bill mentioned be sold at public auction, by the Sheriff of Southampton County, for each, having previously given due and proper notice of the time and place of sale. That said Sheriff out of the proceeds of sale after deducting the costs of the same and also the costs of this suit, pay over to the plaintiff the sum of \$519.59 with interest thereon from the 3rd June 1853 if so much remaining, and pay the balance of said proceeds
