This day the cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the supplemental Bill and exhibits therewith filed against James William B. Shands, which being taken for confessed at the rules and the said Shands still failing to appear and answer, was agreed by counsel, On consideration entered of the court doth adjudge, order and decree that the said William B. Shands after giving due notice thereof by advertising at the Courthouse door and at two or more public places in the said County, proceed to sell at public auction so much of the personal estate of James Roschelle dec'd now in his hands as may be sufficient to satisfy the amount of one hundred and forty six dollars and forty four cents due to the plaintiffs at the November Term of this Court in the year 1857, with interest from December the 28th 1846, and that out of the proceeds of sale he pay to the plaintiffs the said amount and interest together with the costs by them expended in this behalf since the period last above mentioned: But the execution of this decree is to be suspended until the said Commissioners or some person for him execute bond with sufficient security payable to James Hurley and Virginia his wife in the penalty of two hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs.
