bill and exhibits and was apparently Counsel, and it appearing to

having died since the commencement of this suit, it is ordered that the  
bank suit stand record in the name of Joseph H. Rose his  
Attor: On consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge, order and  
decree that Mark T. Peet and Edward D. Turner render before a  
commissioner of this Court an account of their transactions upon  
the estate of S. L. Reese late and also an account of the negro  
kins and a distributor account with any master deceased pertinent  
to himself or which may be required to be so stated by either  
of the parties. And the Court doth further adjudge order and decree  
that Howell Harris, James Harris, John A. Person and Peter  
Edwards or any three of them divide the slaves of S. L. Reese  
deceas'd in such manner as to allot on this in value to Mary Rose  
the widow to be held by her during her natural life, and the  
remainder into two equal parts and allot one to Helen S. Rose  
and the other to Rose Rose forsooth to herself. But the execution of  
this decree is to be suspended until the parties plffs respectively  
or some one for them shall execute each a remanding bond in the  
penalty of five thousand dollars payable to the Executrix of the  
testate S. L. Reese with condition as the law requires.
