This cause being taken for confessed at rules by the defendants Mark T. Peets of Edward S. Turner, this day came on to be heard on the bill and exhibits and was argued by counsel, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that Walter J. Reese one of the parties plaintiffs having died since the commencement of this suit, it is ordered that the said suit stand revived in the name of Joseph H. Reese his administrator. On consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Mark T. Peets and Edward S. Turner render before a commissioner of this Court an account of their transactions upon the estate of J. B. Reese dec'd and also an account of the moneys he has and a distribution account with any matter become pertinent by himself or which may be supposed to be so, state by return of the parties. And the Court doth further adjudge order and decree that Howell Harris, James Harris, John A. Brown and Peter Edwards or any three of them divide the slaves of J. B. Reese dec'd in such manner as to allot on them in value to Mary Reese the widow to be held by her during her natural life, and the remainder into two equal parts one allot on to Nelson S. Reese and the other to Rosa Reese forport to her. And the execution of this decree is to be suspended until the parties plaintiffs respectively or some one for them shall execute each a responding bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars payable to the Executors of the testator J. B. Reese with condition as the law requires.
