It appearing by satisfactory evidence to the Court that the defendants Richard Joyner is no inhabitant of this State, and against whom the plaintiff appears to have proceeded in the mode prescribed by Law, and he still failing to answer (as in the bill of the complainants heretofore) been taken for confessed at the rules against the defendant Elijah Joyner adm'r of John Groatmyer deceased? and he still failing to answer the said bill (as the cause coming on to be heard on the said bill of the complainants together with the exhibits therewith, the answer of John Litchfield and Sally Ann Litchfield, his wife) was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court without settling of the principles of the case both adjudge, order and decree that a Commissioner of this Court take an account of the transaction of Elijah Joyner as adm'r of John Groatmyer deceased and that the said Commissioner take and account of the outstanding debt due (and owing) from the estate of the said defendant shewing the dignity and character thereof, which account the said Commissioner will state and report with any matter specially stated or required by the parties to be so stated; and the Court doth order that the said Commissioner give due notice of the taking the said account by advertisement published once a week for four successive weeks, in some convenient newspaper and that such publication shall be equivalent to personal service of such notice.

The bill of the complainant having been taken for confessed at the rules as to the defendants James Williams and William Williams and they still failing to answer (and it appearing to the Court that the plaintiff had proceeded in the mode prescribed by Law as to the absent defendant Edwin Williams and he still failing to appear and answer the bill is taken for confessed as to him) This cause this day came on to be heard on the bill, answers of the defendants Nathaniel Loring and Edwin Williams in his own right and as adm'r of Martha Williams her replevin, debts, re-liefs, and execution of witness and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court both adjudge, order and decree that William H. Cobb who is appointed a Commissioner for that purpose, after giving at least twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, sell to the highest bidder at public auction, the land and slaves of which Martha Williams died seized
