

Thomas Ridley & Samuel Drury execs. of Henry B. Vaughan dec'd & Defts }
against }
William Parker, Fayette Parker, Virginia Parker, Thomas Vaughan & others Deftd

This day the cause came on finally to be heard on the papers filed. Heard together with the report of James R. Jones, Esquire, made pursuant to the order of May Term 1853, to which no exception has been filed and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the court confirming said report doth adjudge order and decree that Thomas Ridley and Samuel Drury executors of Henry B. Vaughan dec'd pay to Fayette Parker the sum of \$1.10 with interest thereon from the 10th January 1853, to Virginia Parker the sum of seventy cents with like interest. To William Parker the sum of twenty nine cents with interest thereon from the 5th March 1853. To Edward Mayles the sum of four thousand three hundred and thirty dollars and fifty six cents with interest thereon from the 18th July 1853. That Thomas Vaughan pay to the said Ridley and Drury, Executors as aforesaid the sum of \$10.54 with interest thereon from the 18th December 1852.

The Court doth further order, adjudge and decree that the said Thomas Ridley and Samuel Drury executors of Henry B. Vaughan do deliver to Edward Mayles the negro child (Calicut) in the bill mentioned born between the date of the testator's will and his death, and that said executors out of the sum of \$100. retained in their hands for the purpose pay the costs of this suit: and if any amount remains in their hands after satisfying said costs pay the same to the said Edward Mayles. But the execution of this decree is to be suspended until the guardian at law of the said Edward Mayles or some other person shall execute to said executors a sufficient bond conditions according to law in the penalty of six thousand dollars if the said executors shall require the execution of said bond.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning next at twelve.
