The death of Huming J. Smith is suggested and this day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read, the petition of Harrison D Moore and the returns of Samuel Kells Sheriff of Southampton County. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge order and decree that the said Samuel Kells Sheriff as aforesaid collect the said bonds of John F Barker, Harrison D Moore and Mary Mills, executed for the heirs of the said slave during a part of the year 1853, and after deducting the expenses of collecting pay over the balance to Harrison D Moore guardian of Anna J Harrison, and that he pay over to the said Moore guardian as aforesaid the bonds of Mills D Sumner and H. D. Moore executed for the heirs of the said slave for the year 1854 and report to Court. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that the said Samuel Kells Sheriff as aforesaid deliver the slaves Charles, Jacob, Henry & George children to Harrison D Moore guardian of Anna J Harrison after the expiration of the term for which they are now hired out and make report thereof to the Court. But this decree is to be suspended until the applicant Harrison D Moore vacates in the County Court of Southampton County as guardian of Anna J Harrison an additional bond with sufficient security in such penalty as the said County Court may deem proper conditioned according to law.

This cause came on to be heard on the bill, answers of the infant defendants by their Guardian, ad litem & answers of the other defendants, replications, exhibits, and exhibits and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court doth also adjudge, and decree that Richard A. Weyghant who for such purpose is appointed Commissioner after having advertised the time and place of sale, for at least twenty days, will sell at public auction to the highest bidder in a credit of six or twelve months such so much as may be required to defray expenses of sale which may be in each the following property in the bill mentioned to wit: The "Olden Branch tract," "Weyghant's Store" and the Applewhite tract & the houses & lots & ware & store house & wharf property on Smithfield, Isle of Wight County. Taking from the purchase or purchases two bonds with approved security payable to the Commissioner, and pay over bonds to the amount of one fourth of the proceeds of the sale of said property to A. B. Weyghant, one fourth to Charles F. Weyghant, one fourth to Richard A. Weyghant, one fourth to James B. Weyghant. And the Court doth further order and decree that Peter Holmes, Wm. H. Sumner, Robert Drilling, John Boykin, & Ad. H. Burges, (any three or more of whom may act) are hereby appointed Commissioners for the following purposes viz: They after Southampton County (not including the tracts above decreed to be sold) belonging to the estate of late James B. Weyghant called Weyghant and the several James Weyghant thereto attached, and
