The death of Humming F. Smith is suggested and this day this cause comes again to be heard on the papers formerly read, the petition of Harrison D. Moore and the returns of Samuel Hells Sheriff of Southampton County. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge and decree that the said Samuel Hells Sheriff as aforesaid collect the bad debts of John F. Parker, Harrison D. Moore and Mary Hells, executors for the heirs of the said slaves during a part of the year 1853, and after deducting the expenses of collecting pay over the balances to Harrison D. Moore guardian of Anna J. Harrison, and that he pay over to the said Moore guardian as aforesaid the funds of Hells & Sumner and H. D. Moore executed for the heirs of the said slaves for the year 1854 and report to Court. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that the said Samuel Hells Sheriff as aforesaid deliver the slaves Charles, Jack, Henry & three children to Harrison D. Moore guardian of Anna J. Harrison after the collection of the sums for which they are now held out and make report thereof to the Court. But this decree is to be suspended until the plaintiff Harrison D. Moore execute in the County, town of Southampton County as guardian of Anna J. Harrison an additional bond with sufficient security under penalty as the said County Court may deem proper conditioned according to law.

This cause came on to be heard on the bill, answers of the infant defendants by their Guardian ad Litem, answers of the other defendants, replication, traverse, and rebates and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court doth also adjudge and decree that Richard A. Nequhart who for such purpose is appointed Commissioner after having advertised the time and place of sale, for at least twenty days, will sell at public auction to the highest bidder on a credit of six months, have so much as may be required to defray expenses of sale which may be in each the following property in the said mentioned town: The Olson Branch tract, "Nequhart's Store" and the Appelwhite tract of the house & lots & ware & stock house & wharf property in Smithfield, Isle of Wight County. Taking from the possession of James B. Nequhart his bonds with sufficient security payable to the Commissioner and pay over bonds to the amount of one fourth of the proceeds of the sale of said property to A. B. Nequhart, one fourth to Charles F. Nequhart, one fourth to Richard A. Nequhart, and one fourth to the executors of James B. Nequhart. And the Court doth further order and decree that Peter Holmes, Wm H. Sumnerall, Robert Pittin, John Boykin, & A. S. H. Rogers, (any three or more of whom may act) are hereby appointed Commissioners for the following purposes viz: They after having been duly sworn, shall examine & view the real estate situated in Southampton County (not including the tracts above deeded to be sold) belonging to the estate of late James B. Nequhart called Barrigue and the several farms & streets thereto attached, and
