This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read together with the report of
Commissioner Godoyal made pursuant to the order of May Term 1854, to which no exceptions have
been filed and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court confirming said report
doth adjudge, order and decree that Samuel Hells administrator of John Coxon out of the effects of
his intestate, Segars Run surviving administrator of Richard A. Hells out of the effects of his
intestate, Samuel H. Pond and Mahala Pond, pay to the plaintiff Robert P. Stephenson the sum
of two hundred and forty five dollars and forty two cents with interest thereon from the 5th day of
November 1852 till paid, together with the costs of this suit. But this decree is without prejudice
to the rights of the defendants William Coxon, R. H. Coxon and wife and William Ballaway & wife
who may hereafter assert their rights.
