On consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge, order & decree that William Biggs (and his heirs) pay of John Washington's debt unto the said Commissioners of this Court an account of the transactions in the said Washington's estate. That the said Commissioners make out a statement of the accounts which each one entitled to the said Washington's estate shall receive. That he also make out a statement of the share purchased by William Biggs the elder of those entitled to the said Washington's estate. The Commissioners will report the foregoing accounts and statements to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which may be required by either of the parties to be so stated. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that due notice of the time & place of showing such accounts be published once a week for four successive weeks in some paper published in the town of Norfolk or Portsmouth, and that such publication shall be equivalent to personal service on the parties or any of them.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning ten o'clock
