This day this cause came or again to be heard on the papers formerly read and the report of Commissioner Holt made pursuant to an order of this Court entered at November Term last and to which no exceptions have been filed and was argued by counsel on consideration whereof the Court confirming the said report doth adjudge order and decree that William D. Shands who is hereby appointed a official Commissioner for that purpose, shall after having given reasonable notice of the time and place of sale by public advertisement at the courthouse and at other places, proceed to sell the tract of land whereof the said John Swallowing died seized and possessed on the following terms to wit, sufficient of the purchase money in cash to defray the costs of the suit, and the balance on a credit of nine months, and on the payment of the same, that the said Commissioner pay to William Marper Twenty one dollars and forty nine cents, to William J. Scoville twenty dollars, to R. J.
