This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and the report of Commissioner Colth made pursuant to an order of this Court entered at November Term last and to which no exceptions have been filed and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court confirming the said report doth adjudge order and decree that William B. Bowdoin who is hereby appointed a Special Commissioner for that purpose, shall after having given reasonable notice of the time and place of sale by public advertisement at the Court house and at other places, proceed to sell the tract of land whereof the said John B. Watling died seized and possessed on the following terms to wit. Sufficient of the purchase money in cash to defray the costs of this suit, and discharge on a credit of nine months, and on the payment of the same sum that the said Commissioner pay to William Muspel twenty one dollars and forty nine cents, to William J. Powell twenty dollars, to R. J. Bowdoin two debts amounting together to about two shares to John Kitchin and Sally his wife and one share to Richard J. Ogden, and report to Court in order to a further decree. But the said William B. Bowdoin is not to act the penalty of two hundred and fifty dollars with security conditioned as the law directs -
