Cornwell who is hereby appointed a commissioner for that purpose, make sale of the tract of land in the bill next proceedings mentioned at public auction to the highest bidder, before the Court house door of Southwicks County on or before Monday next, day or giving twenty days previous notice of the time and place of sale, public in a newspaper published in a suitable city, and by printed hand bills posted at the various public places in that County, upon the following terms to wit, for cash sufficient to pay the costs of suit and expenses of sale and the balance upon a credit of six and nine months, taking from the purchaser two bonds in equal amounts with approved security payable to the said Commissioner and retaining the title till the further order of the Court. And the said Commissioner will report his proceedings in the premises and return said bonds to Court.
