Court day after giving twenty days previous notice of the time and place of sale, in a newspaper
published in Norfolk City, and by printed hand bills pasted at the various public places in that County, upon
the following terms to wit for each sufficient to pay the costs of suit and expenses of sale and the balance
upon a credit of six and nine months taking from the purchase two bonds in equal amounts with approved
security payable to the said Commissioner and returning the other till the further order of the court.
And the said Commissioner will report his proceedings in the premises and return said bonds to court.

Simeon Colby made pursuant to the order of the November Term 1854 to which report there is no exception
and was argued by Comell. On consideration whereof the Court confirming the underforfth doth adjudge
order and decree that the Defendant Osorrell Peper pay to the Plaintiff the sum of five thousand three
hundred and thirty one dollars forty seven cents with interest on two hundred fifty one \$51/00, paid
thereon from December 31st 1853 and on four hundred fifty seven \$457/00 dollars another part thereof
from July 1st 1855 till paid and on six hundred and four hundred and four \$604/00 dollars the residue thereof
from the 1st day of January 1855 till paid, the last amount being the value of the slaves of Jameson
F. Peper given over by Osorrell Peper to the state of Georgia, and leave is granted to the plaintiff to apply
