ought as distributor of Wills M. Barrett doth remit for his own use  
the balance of the sum ascertained by said report to be due by him  
And it is further ordered and decreed that Benjamin Devany  
Joseph E. Bellotti, William Edwards, Joshua Pittin & Moody  
Smith, he and they are hereby appointed Commissioners any three  
of whom may act to divide the remaining slaves of which Amanda  
St. Barret was in possession during her life as shown by re-  
port of Comr. Edward Nancey; slaves Harry, Abby,  
Joe, Agnes, William, Shadrack, Mary, Sislon and Sam'ls grand  
sons children of Abby born since report between the Plaintiff  
Richard Barrett as distributor of Wills M. Barrett debts  
and the defendant Chester R. Barrett and in such division  
the said Commissioners will bring into the common fund for de-  
cision the slave Harry as of the value of \$625.00 and  
the girl Charlotte as of the value of \$800.00 being  
the price the said slaves were sold for by the said Richard  
Barrett and then assign to the said Plaintiff Richard Barrett  
one half in value of the said slaves including said Harry and  
Charlotte at the prices aforesaid and deduct from his said share  
therein sum of \$425.00 received by him as aforesaid for the sale  
of Harry & Charlotte and assign and deliver to him the residue  
of his share thus ascertained in the other slaves above mentioned and  
the said Commissioners will allot to the said infant defendant  
Chester R. Barrett the residue of the said slaves for his half  
share thereof to be ascertained as aforesaid and make report  
to Court.

And the Commissioners appointed to divide the  
land in proceedings in this cause on motion having reported that a  
partition of the same was inconvenient and recommended a sale thereof  
and the Plaintiff having declined to accept the said land at  
the value fixed by said Commissioners, the Court concurring and approving  
the said report with adjudge, order and decree that John D.  
Chambliss and Eggleston Taylor who are hereby appointed Com-  
missioners for that purpose do proceed after having advertised  
the time, place and terms of sale at the Courthouses of this  
County or some Court day and at one or more public  
places convenient to the premises and also in one or more of the New-  
spapers published in the City of Norfolk, to sell the real  
estate in the bill and proceeding mentioned, being a certain  
tract of land in the County of Southampton near Murfrees  
Depot on which Wills Mifflin resided at the time of his death  
the said sale to be made at public auction in front of the  
Courthouse of this County on some Court day upon the following  
terms: First; for so much cash as will pay the expenses  
of sale and the costs of this suit, one third of the residue  
on a credit of nine months, and the residue on a credit of two  
years from the day of sale the credit installments to bear  
interest from the day of sale, taking from the purchaser bonds  
with good personal security for the deferred payment to  
be returned with their report, and the title to be retained
