This cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read  
and upon the report of Commissioner Cobb made pursuant to the order  
of May term last to which report there is no exception and was argued  
by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth approve and  
confirm said report and doth adjudge, order and decree that William  
S. Goodenow who is appointed Commissioner of Court for that purpose  
do proceed after having determined the time place and terms of sale, as  
the door of the Courthouse of Southampton County and also at other  
public places in the neighborhood of the land to be sold for four  
weeks from the day of sale to sell the real estate in the bill  
and proceedings mentioned of which Henry S. Bittle died seized  
and possessed consisting of a tract of land of about 300 acres  
in the County of Southampton at public auction in front of the  
door of the Courthouse of said County on some Court day that  
the said Commissioner for the proceeds of sale take from the  
purchaser bond with good personal security payable six months  
after the day of sale and the title be retained until the further  
order of Court. And the Court doth further adjudge, order  
and decree that the same Commissioner take and account showing  
what amount in full simple the deforced Sarah C. Vick is  
entitled to receive in lieu of her right of dower in the real estate  
aforesaid. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree  
that the same Com. ascertain and report whether Henry S. Bittle in his  
lifetime had received from John R. Davis Esq of the County of  
Stafford conveyance for the real estate in the proceedings mentioned and if  
not whether any part of the purchase money for the same remained  
unpaid at the death of the said Bittle and the amount of any so  
remaining unpaid and whether the said Davis upon payment of the  
full amount of the purchase money will be willing to execute a  
conveyance of the same with a Com. appointed by an order of this Court  
All which the said Com. is directed to state and report to Court  
with any matter especially stated deemed pertinent by himself or  
required to be so stated by either of the parties. But this decree  
is to be suspended so far as the sale of the real estate is con-  
cerned until the said Com. shall execute bond in the Clerk's  
Office payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia with good  
security in the penalty of \$800.00 conditional faithfully to  
discharge the duties of his Office or trust under this decree.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning Ten O'clock.
