Goddard £100, for T. R. Edwards £10, S. Hills Sheriff 50 Pds, and for himself £10, as attorney for R. Pittler for £294. 10^s per cent £. H. Bishop £20. 4^s per cent Thomas P. Gibbs personal representative £25. 4^s per cent Samuel M. Boardman £159 after for the Farmers Bank of 8^s on their claim £1. 10^s 4^s per cent and for the Bank of V. Petersburg £159 4^s per cent and that Richard D. Baker as attorney for Farmers Bank £1. 2^s in total amount check for £111. 2^s per cent the above sums being in full of the amount or deposit to the credit of this suit in the Norfolk Savings Institution and due to the several parties above named as shown by said report. And it is further ordered that receipts of the several parties occurring may under this decree be filed with the papers in this suit.

This day the cause came on to be further heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of J. R. Chamberlain & Taggert Taylor on the decree of November Seven 1856, to which no exception had been filed, and was argued by Council. By consideration whereof the Court adopting and affirming said report doth adjudge, order and decree that J. R. Chamberlain who is appointed as Commissioner for the purpose receive from the Clerk of this Court, the bonds executed by H. & J. Hill & others, one for £897. 52 - due 17th December 1856 and the other for £795. 10^s due December 17th 1857 and collect the same and when collected pay over half to Richard Barrett in his next right and the other half to Richard Barritt guardian to Erastus D. Barritt his infant son who is required to back out the sum or good and sufficient security and report to Court. And that the said Commissioner report to Court in order to a final decree.

But this decree shall be suspended until the said J. R. Chamberlain shall intercede bond with sufficient security in the penalty of £2000 in the Clerk's Office of this Court in default for the faithful performance thereof, and until the said guardian shall intercede bond in the Clerk's Office with sufficient security in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned to perform what is contained of him by this decree, which bonds shall be made payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia.
