In this case the day came at an instant when the papers formerly read and with  
report of the Commissioner Mr. J. Mayett made, insufficiency of a decree of this court  
rendered at the last November Term thereof, to which no exception being filed  
the same is hereby confirmed. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge,  
order and decree that Mary A. Brown check upon an attested copy  
of this decree upon the Norfolk Savings Institution for the sum of  
Seven hundred and eighty eight dollars and forty cents (\$788.40 cents)  
paid of the money deposited to the credit of this suit in the said Savings  
Institution by Mr. J. Mayett Comr. on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1856  
and for the further sum in like manner of eight hundred and thirty Dollars  
Eighty six cents (\$80.86) per cent of the sum deposited by said Mayett to  
the credit of the said suit on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of April A.D. 1857 with  
such interest on each of the several parcels of the said principal so  
deposited as may be due thereon; and that the other two plaintiffs  
Billy Brown and Jacob F. Brown upon a like attested copy of this  
decree check upon the said Norfolk Savings Institution for on eighth  
part of the residue mons so deposited to the credit of the said suit in  
this cause that is to say for the sum of four hundred and fourteen dollars  
and thirty four cents (\$414.34 cents) to each of them parcel of the  
said sum deposited May 29<sup>th</sup> 1856, and for the sum of four hundred  
and forty three dollars and eighty eight cents (\$443.88 cents) to each of  
them parcel of the said sum deposited April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1857 with  
such interest on each of the said sums as may be due thereon.  
And as to the balance of the subject not herein disposed of the court  
is continued till the next Term.
