This day this cause came on to be again heard on the papers formerly read, on the report of Comm. James H. Powell made pursuant to the order of the May Term 1857 to which report there is no exception, and on statement made in de, and was argued by counsel. On consideration thereof the court confirming the said report and adopting the statement, de, doth adjudge, order and decree that Erwin Briffen admin^r of William A. Briffen dec^d pay the following amounts to wit: to Robert M. Dole \$5.85⁰⁰, to William Atkinson \$7.55, to Joseph W. Williams \$9.49⁰⁰ and \$28.99⁰⁰ to Ben^t G. Edwards \$27.23⁰⁰ to Black Creek Church \$5.77⁰⁰, to W^m Ball \$7.98, to James Holmes \$4.93⁰⁰ to Ben^t Brown \$10.16 to Erwin Briffen \$12.16, to Erwin Duck \$13.10⁰⁰ to Robert M. Dole \$31.29 to Darden & Savage \$1.61 to R. D. Darden \$0.87 to Matthew Morris \$43.91 to Mordecai Bradshaw \$53.92 \$28.16 and \$37.91⁰⁰ and to Elizabeth Foster \$43.98 and unless the defendant Eugene J. Briffen or some one for him before the expiration of six months shall pay the following sums to wit: to Robert M. Dole \$6.53⁰⁰ to W^m Atkinson \$5.26 to Joseph W. Williams \$11.17 \$24.70⁰⁰ to Robert G. Edwards \$38.49⁰⁰ to Black Creek Church \$6.72⁰⁰ to W^m Ball \$8.42 to James Holmes \$5.57⁰⁰ to Ben^t Brown \$14.50 to Erwin Briffen \$15.50 to Erwin Duck \$12.67⁰⁰ to Robert M. Dole \$35.26 to Darden & Savage \$1.81 to R. D. Darden \$0.76 to Matthew Morris \$49.16 to Mordecai Bradshaw \$58.24 \$32.89 and \$19.54⁰⁰ and to Elizabeth Foster \$49.26 with interest on each from this date, then Erwin Briffen who is hereby appointed a special Commissioner for that purpose shall after having given twenty days notice by advertisement of the Court house and at two or more public places, sell the land in the title mentioned, whereof the said William A. Briffen dec^d, deigned and possessed to the highest bidder at public auction, and after receiving so much in cash as may be required to pay the expenses of such sale and the costs of this suit, that for the balance of the proceeds thereof he take bond with good security payable in twelve months and when the said with his report to Court. But this decree shall be of no effect until the said Erwin Briffen shall have entered into bond in the Clerk's Office of this Court payable to the Commissioners of Virginia on the penalty of \$1500 with good security conditioned faithfully to discharge his duties as such Commissioner.
