This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of Commissioner Hapsburg made pursuant to the order of the November Term 1856 to which report there is no exception and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court confirming the said report, doth adjudge order and decree that E. W. Hapsburg pay to John M. Gurley administrator of William Bardot the sum of \$17.88 cents reported to be in his hands in cash and that the said E. W. Hapsburg who is hereby appointed a special Commissioner for that purpose receive from the Clerk's Office of this Court the said bond against Abram Reddick and Geo. W. Park and collect the same so soon as it shall be due, and when so collected execute a deed with special warranty to the said Reddick for the said land and pay over the proceeds of said collection to the said John M. Gurley administrator of William Bardot in part satisfaction of the bond filed in this cause for \$600. due January the 1st. 1852. and report to Court. But this decree shall be of no effect until the said E. W. Hapsburg shall have entered into bond in the Clerk's Office of this Court payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the penalty of \$12.00 with good security conditioned faithfully to discharge his duties as such Commissioner.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till Monday morning next ten o'clock
