This day this cause came on to be heard on the plaintiffs bill, the joint answer of the infant defendants Beul C. Frances M. Richard L. and Maria T. Vaughan by J. D. Edwards their guardian and their and general replication thereto, exhibits filed and depositions of witnesses and was argued by Counsel, on the hearing whereof the Court doth adjudge order and decree that James M. Mumfessel, Leonard C. Cobb, Samuel W. Cobb, Matthew H. Vaughan and Jacob Sauer who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose, any three of whom may act, having been first duly sworn, do proceed to lay off and divide the real estate of which Thomas Vaughan died, bequeathed and proposed lying in the County of Southampton, supposed to be about two hundred and thirty acres more or less, into four equal shares, having regard to quality and quantity, and assign one fifth part thereof to Augustus Crumpler and Virginia his wife, one fifth part thereof to Beul C. Vaughan, one fifth part thereof to Frances M. Vaughan, one fifth part thereof to Richard L. Vaughan and one fifth part thereof to Maria T. Vaughan. But if like said Commissioners should find it impracticable to divide the said land among the aforesaid parties or should be of the opinion that the interest of the said parties would be promoted by a sale of the same in such case they are required to report the facts upon which their opinion is based to the Court, and also what in their opinion is the fair simple value of the whole of the real estate of which Thomas Vaughan died, bequeathed and proposed and in either case they are required to report their proceedings under this decree to this Court.
