This day this cause came on to be heard on the plaintiffs bill the joint names of the infant Defendants below and general replication thereto, which filed and depositions of witnesses and was argued by Coshell, on the hearing whereof the Court doth adjudge order and direct that James W. Murphy, Leonard L. Cobb, Daniel H. Cobb, Matthew H. Vaughan and Jacob Lewis who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose, any three of whom may act, having been first duly sworn, do proceed to lay off and divide the real estate of which Thomas Vaughan died, deceased and possessed lying in the County of Southampton, supposed to be about two hundred and thirty acres more or less, into five equal shares, having regard to quality and quantity, and assign one fifth part thereof to Augustus Crumpler and Virginia his wife, one fifth part thereof to Beulah Vaughan, one fifth part thereof to Frances M. Vaughan, one fifth part thereof to Richard L. Vaughan and one fifth part thereof to Maria T Vaughan. But if the said Commissioners should find it impracticable to divide the said lands among the aforesaid parties or should be of the opinion that the interests of the said parties would be promoted by a sale of the same, in such case they are required to report the facts upon which their opinion is based to the Court, and also what in their opinion is the fair simple value of the whole of the real estate of which Thomas Vaughan died, deceased and possessed and in either case they are required to report their proceedings under this decree to this Court.

Williams dec'd before a Commissioner of this Court, and that he pay to the estate of James Kitchen the sum of one hundred and eighty nine dollars twenty two cents and uncle Ephraim Harrison, Coshell, Administrator and George Williams personal friend on their behalf children and heirs at law of John R. Williams shall within thirty days from the date of this decree pay to Harrison P. Pope the sum of \$23.43 cents to Mr. B. Stands the sum of \$21.21 cents to J. H. Ethridge the sum of \$777.97 cents to Irving Dick guardian of Martha & Justina Eley the sum of \$33.87 cents to Irving D. Dick guardian of Indiana Eley the sum of \$24.10 cents to Washington L. Riddick the sum of \$23.15 cents, to Alfred Gardner the sum of \$24.73 cents to Francis Ross the sum of \$2.53 cents to William Murphy the sum of \$34.35 cents to Louis T.
