On motion of Morris F. Harris, she is allowed to be made a Defendant in this cause instead of one of the defendants and this cause came on this day to be further heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of Arthur Colby made in pursuance of a decree of this Court at New Haven 1856 and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court adopting and confirming said report to which no exception has been filed, doth adjudge, order and decree that Therophilus F. Harris Executor of Amos Harris after providing for the payment of \$407.45 with interest thereon from 1st Sept 1857 being the amount due to him in his executory account filed in this cause and the sum of \$193.54 due to him as quasi guardian with interest from 31st December 1856 and also for the sum of \$1000.00 with interest from the date of this decree to be paid to William F. Harris being the Legatee under the will of the testator and retaining for himself the sum of \$1000.00 then debited up for sale and division the lands & slaves of his heir Amos Harris did sever & propose except the lands devised to William F. Harris. And the Court doth further adjudge, order & decree that William F. Harris, James Henry, Joseph H. Colby and Samuel Emory may their opinion may not, proceed after being duly sworn before a Justice of the peace to divide the said slaves so as to allot the following Morris F. Harris and the said Julius C. Harris each 1/4 thereof in value and the remainder to be kept together for the joint benefit of the infant defendants Sarah C., Martha J., Estlin L., Missions, James C., Ella and Rosa Harris until the further order of this Court and make report thereof to the Court. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that Therophilus F. Harris who is hereby appointed attorney in fact for the purpose aforesaid having executed the necessary papers and bonds of this for thirty days to be executed at New Haven public place in the neighborhood and at the Court House door of this County in some Court day proceed to sell on the premises the said estate
