Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court adopting an injunction and
report to which no exception has been filed, doth adjudge, order & decree that

viding for the payment of \$407.484 with interest thereon from 1st Sept 1857
being the amount due to him on his executant account held in this cause and
the sum of \$195.584 due to him as general creditor with interest from 1st Dec

date of this decree. To be paid to Millard F. Harris being the legatee under
the will of the testator and retaining for himself the sum of \$1000.00
then deliver up for sale one division the lands of his late
Horrell Harris died seized of properties except the lands devised to Millard
F. Harris. And the Court doth further adjudge, order & decree that
