

a Special Commissioner for such purpose shall after having given twenty days notice by advertisement at the Courthouse door and two or more public places, sell the land and the bill mentioned whereof the said William H. Griffis died seized and professed to the highest bidder at public auction and after recovering so much cash as may be required to pay the expenses of such sale and the costs of this suit that for the balance of the proceeds thereof to take bond with good security payable in twelve months with interest from date and return the same with his report, and that a Commissioner of this Court take a further account of the debts outstanding against the estate of W. H. Griffis of any and report the same. But this decree is to be suspended until the said Davis Griffis shall have entered into bond with good security in the Clerks Office of this Court payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of \$1000 conditioned faithfully to discharge his duties as such Commissioner.

In the R. I. Joseph B. Pope infant under the age of thirty one years by Harrison P. Pope the guardian ad litem assigned to defend them in this suit. Dated
 This cause came on this day to be heard on the original bill the issues of which were
 stated by Harrison P. Pope, this guardian with application thereto and exhibits, and was
 argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth order that Dennis
 Baileys, James J. Darby, Lewis S. Pope and Elizabeth Myrick, who are
 appointed Commissioners for the purpose, any three of whom may act having
 their first duty served, to process to lay off and divide the real estate of which
 John D. Stephenson died seized and professed, consisting of a certain tract or
 parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and containing about four
 hundred and fifty eight acres and bounded by the lands of A. H. Stephenson
 Thomas Ridley and others first into two equal shares having regard to quality,
 and quantity and assign one share a half to A. H. Stephenson
 and divide the other share a half into two equal parts respectively and
 assign one to Joseph B. Pope and the other to Joseph B. Pope infant
 children of Harrison P. Pope. But if the said Commissioners should
 find it impossible to divide the said real estate among the said parties
 it should be of opinion that the interest of the said parties would be
 divided that the interest of each party would be more promoted by
 a sale of the same in such case they are required to report the facts upon
 which this opinion is based to the Court, and also what in their opinion
 is the fair simple value of the whole of the real estate of which
 the said Mr. D. Stephenson died seized and professed; and in either
 case they are required to report their proceedings under this order to the
 Court.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till November running next unless otherwise directed.
