The cause came in this day to be heard upon the bill, the answer of the infant defendants by Richard M. Cass their guardian ad litem this day filed by leave of the Court with reservation thereto, exhibits, and the examination of witnesses and was argued by Counsel: On consideration whereof the Court doth decide that Davis Bennett, Harrison S. Rose, a Slave R. Stevenson, James W.

Parker, James J. Darden and John W. Murphy who are appointed Commissioners for the purpose, any three of whom may act, having been first duly sworn, do present to lay off and divide the real estate of which Phillip J. Elam did die, so far as it may be justly entitled with Amos S. Rose which said real estate is especially described in the bill filed by the said Amos S. Rose. The plaintiff in this cause containing about four hundred and Sixty acres bounded by the lands of Richard Darden and others uniting in the County of Southampton, first into two equal shares having regard to quantity and quality one being one share or half to Amos S. Rose and divide the other share or half into three equal portions or parcels and assign one to Fayetta J. Elam, one to Mary E. Elam and the other to John R. Elam infant children of Phillip J. Elam.

But if the said commissioners should find it to be impracticable to divide the said real estate among these said parties or should be of opinion that the interest of the said parties would be more promoted by a sale of the same in such case they are required to report to the Court their acts report which their opinion is based and also what in their opinion is the fee simple value of the whole of the real estate of which the said Phillip J. Elam did die, so far as it may be justly entitled with the said Amos S. Rose or otherwise. And in either case they are required to report their proceedings under this decree to the Court.

All writings and causes pending in this Court and not otherwise disposed of are severally continued until the next term.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until the first day of the next term.
