This day this court came or again to be heard on the papers formerly made and on
the reports of the commissioners under the decree of November Term 1857 and was
argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the court concurring and adopting
said reports to which no exception has been filed, doth adjudge, order and decree, that
the said reports be binding and conclusive. And the court doth further adjudge,
order and decree that Philadelphus F. Harris, receive from the clerks of this court the
bonds filed with his report, being the bonds taken for the purchase of the real estate
in the proceedings mentioned, and collect the same when due, and out of the amount
thereof, pay to the guardian of Millard F. Harris the sum of One thousand dollars
with interest thereon from 10th day of November 1857, and make report thereof to
this court. But the decree in respect to the collection of the bonds shall be suspended
until the said Philadelphus F. Harris or some one for him shall enter into bond of security
in the penalty of three thousand dollars in the clerks Office of this court and before
the clerk, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia and conditioned faithfully to
execute this decree -
