This day the cause came on to be heard on the bill of the complainant against all the dependants general replications thereto and exhibits and was argued by himself. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Edgar J. Williams and Albert S. Gray who are appointed Commissioners for the purpose after having given at least twenty days public notice of the time and place of sale proceed to sell to the highest bidder in the premises or a credit of twelve months as much as may be necessary to pay the expenses of this decree and said sale which shall be for such the tract of land situate in the County of Southampton and containing five hundred and eighty acres and also the undivided interest of the said Giles S. Whitney in a mill with one hundred acres attached thereto situate in said County belonging jointly to the said Giles S. Whitney, William Bradshaw, Alfred T. Stephens and Ludlow Lawrence. That they take bonds from the purchasers with approved security bearing interest from their date (and that they retain the title to the said property until the purchase money is paid.

The Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that a Commissioner of the Court take an account of the transactions of Edgar J. Williams adm^r of Giles S. Whitney dec^d and also an account of all debts due and contracted against the estate of the said Giles S. Whitney with their interest and charges; which accounts the said Commissioner is directed to report to the Court with any matters specially stated or come forward by himself or which he may be required to do by either of the parties.
