This cause came on this day to be again heard upon the papers formerly read and upon the report of Commissioner Howard taken and returned having pursuant to the decree of the 11<sup>th</sup> day of May 1858, to which report no exception have been filed (and was agreed by counsel, on a motion made in which the Court both confirm the said report and both adjudge order and decree that Wm. E. Shields Special Commissioner proceed to collect the bonds returned with his report of sales filed herein on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of January 1858 as they respectively fall due (for which purpose the Clerk of this Court is directed to summon the same to him) and that he collect and receive from Nelson B. Gardner the balance due from him as a whole of Jno. R. Williams decedent as appears by a memorandum upon the report of Comm. Shields aforesaid, and pay out of the funds so collected and received by him the costs of this cause, and the several debts and demands against the estate of Jno. R. Williams decedent, as ascertained and reported by Commissioner Howard in his reports filed herein on the 11<sup>th</sup> Octo 57 and 15<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1857, respectively, and make report of the transactions under this decree to the Court following thereafter the receipt of the several creditors, and upon the collection by him of the several bonds aforesaid, the said Wm.
