This cause came on this day again heard upon the papers formerly read and upon the report of Judge P. Corporal Special Commissioner made pursuant to the decree rendered in this cause on the day of May 1858 and was argued by Council. And it being suggested to the Court that the plaintiff Lucy D. Bond V. and Percival D. Dow to prosecute the same in their behalf. And the interest of the said Lucy D. Dow widow as aforesaid in the fund so questioned having terminated by her death, the Court without for the present taking any action upon the said report of Commissioner except above referred to, doth adjudge, order and decree that a Commissioner of this Court take an account showing the persons to and among whom the sum of Twelve hundred and nine dollars twenty three cents shown by Commissioner Bond's report to be the net amount of sales made to the said Lucy D. Dow dec'd is now distributable, and in what proportions they are entitled to the same, which account the said Commissioner is directed to state, settle and to the Court report together with any matter specially stated, deemed pertinent by himself or which may be required by either party to be so stated.
